84 COLLECTORS ATTEND HARRISON MEET



Willy originally hails from Belgium, endures numer= ous misspellings of his name, notably "van" which most people spell "Von". Writes Willy, "The decade following 1919 was the period of my initial interest in toy trains. I ran O and Standard Gauge trains, mainly Ives and Lionel, followed each year's new developments in the catalogs, and saw something of prototype in travels in this country and in Europe. My present interest naturally tends to be centered in the 1920s, and is not yet particularly specialized. It has snowballed to include Ives, Lionel, and Voltamp before 1920, Märklin, Bing, Dorfan, and other makes, as well as the large sets that are representative of the 1930s. While I bought a Lionel 1928 catalog in 1953, it was only at the 1960 Mulraney auction that I started a collection that has grown fairly rapidly since. I find collecting a pleasant diversion from my principal activity, which is theoretical work in physics at Bell Telephone Laboratories, currently on electrical properties of semiconductors, from which transistors and other related devices are made."
